



Career and Technical Education Programs

Eastpointe High School

Eastpointe High School (EHS) has an application process for admitting students into our Career and Technical Education (CTE) Programs. The CTE programs are available for students that exhibit an interest in any particular program. The application process is to be completed by students.

Complete an application in June, prior to the end of the school year and or at the start of the school year. Applications are obtained from your school's counselors or by contacting the high school's front office.

Who is Eligible for Career Technical Education

You are eligible for CTE if:

- You are a tenth, eleventh or twelfth grader who attends Eastpointe High School
- You exhibit an interest
- You exhibit academic skills
- You exhibit the basic skills necessary for program completion

Students that are enrolled in Career Technical Education are expected to remain in the program until they have achieved the status of completer.

Completer: a student who has completed all state program competencies with a 2.0 or better.

As mentioned by the Michigan Department of Education, the purpose of CTE programs is to prepare students for postsecondary programs or employment in high wage, high skill, high demand occupations. As the American workforce becomes more skilled and technical, the value of CTE programs proves immeasurable for students seeking to gain an edge on their competition. CTE programs provide a link for students from the classroom to the real world that cannot be replicated in other academic programs.

The eligibility and prerequisites will include the identification of the basic skills necessary for program completion and the student's level of interest and understanding in those areas. An admissions committee composed of the current school counselors and the school's CTE Department Head will determine which students are suitable for the program.
